Manuel's Messages...The Jonah Syndrome

In this issue of the newsletter you'll find detailed information about the upcoming *Concert of Praise*, which marks a critical interval in the continuance of a God honoring, collaborative effort between many in the Christian community.

We've purposely designed this day and evening to point the City of Rochester and surrounding communities into a collaborative effort to impact neighborhoods that are wearing the signs of poverty and exhibiting all the symptoms that are attached. This is a **call** to the Christian community to come together as ONE in the "body of **Christ**," to grab hold of this message of hope and translate the words and spirit into tangible and real change.

There are three basic **obstacles** we need to address directly:

- Loss of hope We often disbelieve that change can occur (much like the countless times God's people strayed into unbelief and disregard for the Lord in the Old Testament).
- **Christians divided** The community is fractured due to denominational and racial divisions. These issues are easier left untouched rather than confronted. We know the difficulty in building something strong and how easily it can be destroyed.
- Scarcity of workers "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few." -Luke 10:2.

Leaders: Dr. John Perkins & Darryl Jordan

<u>Dr. Perkins</u> is founder and President of the John M. Perkins Foundation for Reconciliation and Development. He is an internationally known author, speaker and lecturer who is a pioneer in areas of reconciliation, indigenous leadership and community development. A Christianity Today magazine writer said, in his opinion, that John Perkins is "the most influential African American church leader since Dr. King."

Darryl Jordan comes from the Sandtown area of Baltimore and is a leader of the teen choir *Cross Culture*. New Song Urban Ministries grew many of their ideas and plans for turning their community around from the seeds planted by Dr. Perkins in community development.

The purpose of this seminar is to gain ideas and an understanding on how to implement change in our most challenging areas of the city. You will learn how a concerted effort among the Christian churches can make an impact affecting one neighborhood at a time. This is a workshop filled with practicality and hope.

WHY DR. PERKINS? WHY CROSS CULTURE? WHY NOW?



Who is Dr Perkins?

Dr. John M. Perkins is chairman of the John M. Perkins Foundation for Reconciliation and Development. He is a nationally known writer and speaker on these topics, but more importantly, is recognized for his life experiences and his ability to plant seeds and produce fruit in challenging urban areas of Baltimore, Oakland and Chicago.

Why is Dr. Perkins so important?

A pivotal point in his faith walk was kindled nearly 35 years ago in a Mississippi jail where he was beaten, kicked, near death, and with a gun pointed at his head. He discovered his mission of reconciliation and the need for Christian Community Development. Dr. Perkins, a pastor, community leader, teacher and an engaging speaker is a true pioneer in the faith-based movement.

Why haven't we heard more about his message?

An article in **Christianity Today** magazine articulates why Dr. Perkins' work has not been given a larger share of the limelight. "This happens under the radar screen of the national media. I think one of the problems with our whole faith-based debate has been that we haven't really listened carefully to what the people doing the faith-based work are actually saying about themselves. It doesn't lend itself nicely to partisan loyalties. There are things that cut against the grain of the Right, and cut against the grain of the Left."

What will you and I do?

Dr. Perkins opens our eyes and hearts to show a "common ground" for those of us in the Christian community who desire real change in our most burdened neighborhoods. Will we listen? Will we act? Will we consider solutions that are biblically based rather than the highly charged political rhetoric of syndicated talk show programs, leaning left or right, continually dividing and raising barriers? We all know it is easier to trade barbs and blame others than to produce positive change. Positive change doesn't sell. We must change this fact!

Learn more and be part of the plan.

To affirm positive change can and does happen in communities, we have again invited *Cross Culture*, a teen choir from Baltimore's Sandtown community. This dynamic group of youth and their leaders inspired and awed Concert of Praise attendees last year. This group is a product of the Perkins' initiative for building communities. The changes in Sandtown are real and show through the hearts and voices of the *Cross Culture* teen choir. Sandtown has an arts center, after-school programs, health care facilities and growing businesses, in an area that was labeled the "Harlem" of Baltimore.

Rochester, Syracuse, Buffalo and upstate New York could catch and implement this vision that Dr. Perkins has developed and shared with others as part of his life's work! This is the intention of Project URGE. For the last three years, Project URGE has been laying the groundwork for this to occur in our community. Now is the time!

In an article from a 1995 issue of **Urban Family Magazine**, Dr. Perkins wrote, "Did we change America? Yes. Would I do it again? Yes. But did those changes satisfy the longings that gnaw at my gut? No! As long as violence, hopelessness, moral and spiritual decay exist in our inner cities, I will feel that pain."

We as Christians need to share this burden. The time is now!

Williamson School District REACH Program

Williamson School District coordinated its recent senior high service day through Project URGE. Garry Manuel started off the day by speaking to the over 50 students that signed up for this day of service. He gave students an overview of Project URGE and many of the urban ministries that are affiliated.

Students were bussed to various locations in Rochester. Teams of approximately 5 teen students and several adults spent several hours at various ministries doing a variety of service projects.

Carol Verbridge, coordinator of the Williamson REACH project said, "What a great day! Absolutely wonderful! Such experiences and what fantastic people - each such a special individual! Thank you so much for the opportunity to take part in these people's lives - the kids loved it!"

The summer is just around the corner and Summer Camp will be from **July 5 - August 15**, with an estimated 125 eager children ready to register.


- We Need: Volunteers
